George Sylvester Achorn, Jr.

George Sylvester Achorn, Jr., 89, of Hershey, passed away peacefully and surrounded by his family at Lancaster General Hospital on Monday, August 14, 2023. Born in Harrisburg, George was the son of the late George and Ruth (Haller) Achorn of Elizabethtown.

He is survived by Mary Ann (Nixon) Achorn, his loving wife of 62 years, of Hershey; daughter Aimee Fasnacht and her husband Scott of Palmyra; and son George Achorn III and his wife Deanna of Hershey. He is also survived by granddaughters Mina Rose Achorn and Emilia Dorothy Achorn of

Hershey, who know him as "Cool PopPop"; grandchildren Andrew Fasnacht, Katie (Zach) Hooks and Tyler (April) Fasnacht of Atlanta, Georgia; niece Karen Markey and her husband Jeff of Middletown; and nephew Ted Achorn and his wife Regi of Camp Hill.

George graduated from Elizabethtown Area High School in 1951. He attended Franklin & Marshall College for two years, entering as a seminary student and freshman starting catcher on the Diplomat baseball team. He later transferred to Elizabethtown College where he played baseball for the Blue Jays and graduated with a degree in Business Administration in 1955.

After college, George enlisted in the U.S. Navy, and was commissioned as an officer in Newport, Rhode Island, in the fall of 1955. He was then based at Naval Air Station Brunswick in Brunswick, Maine, and stationed in Iceland. As a naval aviator and navigator, he engaged in anti-submarine warfare and air intelligence work monitoring Soviet activity in the Baltic Sea during the height of the Cold War.

George credited his experience in the Navy, along with the love and mentorship of his own father, for developing the leadership skills he used so successfully throughout his lifetime. His Navy years also gave him a genuine love of Maine, which he shared with his family in annual summertime sojourns there.

Upon returning home from the Navy, George had a brief interlude of substitute teaching and coaching baseball at local high schools. In December 1959, he met the love of his life, Mary Ann, a Pittsburgh girl who was student-teaching in the library at Donegal High School. On a snowy evening at Christmastime, he took her on a first date for pie and coffee, and both knew they had met their match.

While courting Mary Ann, George joined his father, George, Sr., in establishing the Achorn Sales Company, an Elizabethtown-based industrial hardware sales representative agency. Across major shifts in the economy and hardware industry,

the company remained steady and strong under George's leadership for 50 years until his retirement.

George contributed to his community as an Elizabethtown Area School District board member, an Elizabethtown Rotary Club president, like his father before him, and a longtime participant with the Mount Joy Rotary Club with over 50 years of perfect attendance.

He was also a member of St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Elizabethtown, Derry Presbyterian Church in Hershey, the Abraham Treichler Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons, the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War in Lancaster, and the Hershey Country Club.

Baseball was a passion in George's life. He fell in love with the sport in 1938 when his father took him to see the Philadelphia A's play at Shibe Park. In the summer of 1947, he was a member of the Elizabethtown Moose team that won the second annual Lancaster New Era Baseball Tournament.

George was always a catcher, recently sharing with his family that he "only ever wanted to be a catcher, because you can see the whole game from that vantage point." In high school, he caught Nelson Chittum, Etown's star pitcher and future major leaguer. Together, in 1951, George and Nelson traveled to Philadelphia to try out for the Phillies and the A's and met baseball legend Connie Mack.

Then, after a successful career playing college ball, George caught on Navy teams that advanced through all-Navy tournaments and played in local adult leagues into his 40s. He coached Elizabethtown Little League after his father helped to found that program in 1952, and baseball teams at the Patton School for Boys and Donegal High School.

George's greatest passion, though, was his family, who benefitted throughout his lifetime from his constant devotion and leadership. He will be remembered gratefully for his loving heart, quiet confidence, independent mind, generous spirit, sound determination, gentle guidance, strength of character, and deep faith.

A private family memorial service was held at the Sell Chapel at the Masonic Village in Elizabethtown, with burial in the Hershey Cemetery. The Achorn family plans to hold a celebration of George's life at a later date. Harold B. Allen ("Harry" or "Mr. A" to his many friends and acquaintances), age 90, of Elizabethtown, Pa. died Tuesday evening, August 26, 2014.

Born in Seattle, Washington on December 1, 1923, he was the son of the late Frances Johnstone Allen and Arthur E. Allen.

He shared 66 years of marriage with Mariana Olweiler Allen.

Harold had several careers including real estate agent, parts specialist at the Mechanicsburg Naval Supply Depot, Olmsted Air Force Base, and Marietta Army Transportation Depot. He worked for the U.S. Defense Department in Korea, training generator specialists from 1969 to 1970. He served in the United States Marine Corps during and after World War II, serving from August 1945 to June 1946 in the Pacific Theater. He played the role of Joe Raber in the film "The Blue Eyed Six."

One of nine siblings, Harold is survived by his wife, Mariana; brother, Thomas A. 

Fred Kaylor ... Typical day in the military, Sep 1967 to Sep 1970:

In my case the typical day needs to be split into two pieces. First the duty serving at Ft. Sill, Oklahoma, and the second part, serving in Germany.

I was deployed to Ft. Sill after basic training at Ft. Benning, Georgia. The deployment consisted of me being pulled out of basic training a week early to start the specialty school for my MOS (Military Occupation Specialty) of a 21G20. The school was a long school, I was promoted to paygrade E-2 and E-3 while in school. At the completion of the school, those above a certain grade level percentage, would gain an additional rank in pay. I was promoted to an E-4. And then assigned to my unit at Ft. Sill, which is covered in the section "Typical day". Prior to my deployment to Germany, an order was issued to provide a "No-Time-In-Grade / No-Time-In-Service" selection process to be advanced to the grade of E-5. I applied, was tested, interviewed, and then selected to be promoted to Specialist 5/E5.

During my tour at Ft. Sill, there were several duties to be performed. In my MOS of a 21G20, or Pershing Missile Maintenance Specialist, I oversaw the countdown sequence of this nuclear missile until the 2-minute mark, and then command was transferred to a higher authority. There were no Pershing missiles on active duty in Oklahoma. Therefore, the duties included putting out brush fires on the firing range of the conventional artillery practice routines. However, when the staff officers found out I could use a typewriter, I became a part of the office staff writing reports for the daily activities of the Battalion. I was then urged to change my MOS to that of a clerk-typist; I refused to do the change because I did not sign-up for that type of job. I am glad I did not because a few weeks after some other's changed their MOS, they received orders to report to duty in Vietnam. Other duties at Ft. Sill included a month of "Flag duty", in which a team of us put up the giant American flag at the General's headquarters at dawn and took it down at dusk. All with shining clean uniforms, polished boots, gleaming brass, and chrome helmets, which we prepared the entire day to make perfect when we unfurled the flag in the morning and folded it into a tight triangle at night. The saddest duty at Ft. Sill, was to be called on for funeral duty. We were called upon to honor the dead, returned from combat, with the flag ceremony and 21-gun salute. It was heartbreaking to see each grieving family morn their son and daughter, who served their country with such gallantry and bravery in the face of the enemy. And, of course, there was always K.P. (kitchen patrol) duty.

Upon being sent to Germany, the scope of the mission changed. We were now on the front line of the Iron Curtain. Our duty was to be ever ready to launch a nuclear missile at the command of the 7th Army.

Our mission was broken into 4 distinct parts. First, In the field on READY mode. Second, released from READY mode, we were back at the barracks



and were able to obtain passes for travel. Third, after we were finished with a brief vacation, we were then moved into MAINTENANCE mode, getting our equipment ready for our next assignment. Last was STAND-BY, where we were READY at a moment's notice to deploy into the field in case the crew in READY mode had an equipment failure and could not perform the mission. Each of these cycles lasted 3 months.

During my deployment to Germany, I was stationed at the small town of Neckarsulm, near Heilbronn, which is about halfway between Stuttgart and Heidelberg. Three interesting activities occurred while I was stationed here.

First, was the upgrading of our equipment to the newer and more advanced Pershing 2 missile system. This involved driving to the northern port of Bremerhaven to pick up the equipment. We drove our older style tracked vehicles on the Autobahn, Germany's high-speed highway with no speed limits. Imagine a tank sized vehicle slowly moving on this super speed highway, but we made it to the port. We then picked up the new vehicles and machinery and headed back. Along the way, we took pictures of the Russian agents' cars, who were taking pictures of us. Of course, on our arrival back at headquarters, the Military Police confiscated all our cameras for the investigation of the Russian photographers; we never got our cameras back.

Second. This was the time of the Soviet Iron Curtain, and everyone was prepared for a clash between the super-powers. August 20, 1968, the USSR

invaded Czechoslovakia! Everyone was called into the field, locations secret, the nuclear missiles were armed and vertical. and the countdown I was to manage was at 2-minutes and holding; and control was handed over to the next level of authority waiting for the launch order. Fortunately, the Russians backed down and the stress of

the impending doom was averted. We knew the Russians were watching us, and we were watching them.

Third. I was privileged to be selected as a "Red Hat" for an inspection

team headed from Germany to White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico. A "Red Hat" was part of a team that evaluated the performance of the "live" firing of a Pershing missile, except, there was no nuclear warhead on the missile. It was a long flight in the jump seat of a C-130 Transport plane, but the experience and excitement of overseeing the inspection and successful launch of a Pershing missile



was quite exhilarating. I was hoping all the training and exercises would never be needed.



99-year-old Elizabethtown WWII vet recalls his time in England, France

Everyone at the Elizabethtown American Legion Post 329 knows **Jim Phillips**.





Sitting at a table recently with photos, a jagged shard of German shrapnel, souvenir Nazi armband, yellowed three-day pass to Paris and commemorative medals including the National Order of the Legion of Honor from French government spread out before him, the 99-year-old World War II veteran and former post commander fielded well wishes and greetings from everyone around him.

Born in Middletown on Aug. 2, 1921, Phillips was 20 when he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1942. After basic training he was assigned to the 313th Field Artillery Battalion, 80th Infantry Division (the "Blue Ridge Division") under Maj. Gen. Joseph D. Patch. The soldiers reported to Camp Forrest, Tennessee. There, Phillips was quickly promoted to sergeant and was put in charge of a forward observation squad that included a jeep and 14 enlisted men with weapons and radio equipment.

"I had no high school diploma, so I don't know why they made me a sergeant," he said. "I think they flipped a coin."

On July 4, 1944, the division loaded aboard the SS Queen Mary for a sea voyage that would end three days later at Greenock, Firth of Clyde, Scotland.

"I'd never seen the ocean," Phillips recalled.

Not everyone made the trans-Atlantic trip.

"There were three older men in my outfit, men in their mid to late 30s," Phillips said.

These men were stopped before boarding and told that, because of their age, they did not have to go overseas if they chose not to. Two accepted the offer but one stayed with Phillips and they soon became friends.

"He never called me sergeant," Phillips recalled. "I called him 'Pop' and he called me 'Hey Boy."

Meeting Patton

After landing in Scotland, the division was transported by train to Northwich, England, for more training, including instruction in waterproofing equipment for the upcoming crossing of the choppy English Channel. The crossing was made aboard Liberty Ships and ponderous tank landing ships or LSTs, dubbed "Large Slow Targets" by their crews. Phillips and his comrades landed in France on Utah Beach on Aug. 2, 1944, Phillips' 23rd birthday.

The 80th Division was attached to Gen. George Patton's Third Army. Phillips recalled the greeting they received from Patton, who was known for his colorful language.

"I'll tell you what, that man could swear," Phillips recalled. "Somebody asked, 'How do we know which Germans to shoot?' Patton replied, 'Kill all them lousy blah, blah,' — all swear words — 'none of them are any good.' "But you either liked Patton or you hated him. I liked him. He got the job done. What other generals would take in two or three weeks; Patton took in a week. He'd call in air support and they'd come in and strafe whatever he asked for," Phillips said.

Before Phillips went into combat, his commanding officer asked if he'd like a three-day pass to see Paris.

"I started telling him, 'Yes, sir, I don't have any money," Phillips said. "He got mad and said, 'That wasn't what I asked you. I asked if you wanted to go to Paris.' I said I'd love to, so he put a blanket on the ground, reached into his pocket and pulled out money and put it on the blanket. Then he asked everyone else, 'Who wants to help Jimmy go to Paris?'" Phillips was also given American cigarettes, which were as good as cash in Paris. So, with the money and a bag full of cigarettes he was off, staying in a Red Cross-managed hotel.

Then it was off to the front.

War stories

His first combat experience was at a French village called Pont-à-Mousson. The men came under fire of a large German railroad gun that was concealed in a forest, safe from Allied air reconnaissance.

"When they wanted to fire it, they'd pull this thing out of the woods and open up," Phillips said. "When the shells hit that town, the ground shook." Phillips kept a jagged chunk of steel about three inches long.

As the "eyes" of a battery of four 105mm field pieces, Philips and members of his observation team were often on the move, staying out in front of the guns and occupying high ground whenever possible to find the best vantage points.

"Every time we moved, we had to pick up the (communication) wire, the radios and field phones and carry everything along with us," he said.

His combat experience included the Battle of the Bulge and liberation of the Buchenwald concentration camp, with all of its horrors of the Holocaust.

The fighting ended on May 8, 1945, but the danger remained.

One day Phillips, a lieutenant and 12 men were assigned to escort a trainload of Russian soldiers who'd been captured by the Germans back to their own lines. The Soviets wanted none of these former prisoners to flee, so every time the train stopped, Phillips and his soldiers got off and patrolled along the length of the train to make sure no Russians jumped off.

"They didn't want to go home," Phillips said of the ex-POWs.

Reaching their destination, they delivered their charges, then stayed overnight before heading back to their own lines. That night, the lieutenant got drunk on vodka and Phillips' men had to load him onto the train next morning for the return trip.

The engineer, a German who was evidently eager to return, opened the train throttle. Roaring toward a checkpoint the Russians had established on the tracks, it became obvious that the engineer had no plans to stop. One of the Americans yelled, "Hit the floor" as two Russian machine guns raked the train. No one was injured in the fusillade.

"The lieutenant, he never woke up," Phillips said. "He really had a load on."

Approaching 100

After the war, Phillips moved to Elizabethtown and went to work at Savoy Shoe Co. He married Ruth Kauffman from Tower City in 1956. He joined the Legion post and served as commander in 1963. Phillips, a 32nd Degree Mason, moved with his wife into Masonic Village 18 years ago; she died in 2014.

When he turned 99 last year, Philips was asked what he wanted for his birthday.

"I said I'd never been up in a helicopter," he recalled. "I had to say something."

That's how he ended up flying from Lancaster Airport to Harrisburg International Airport, a trip that included a low pass over Elizabethtown so his friends on the ground could wave. He doesn't yet know what he wants for his 100th birthday in August but noted that he still has time to decide.

Plummer, 82, of 22 S. Poplar St., Elizabethtown, died Monday morning in Lancaster General Hospital after a long illness. Plummer's name in Elizabethtown was synonymous with the American Legion Post, which he helped found 63 years ago and served three times as commander, and with the Boy Scout movement. A retired salesman for the Simplex Paper Box Corp., he was postmaster of Elizabethtown during the 1920s. He was the husband of Senia Kero Plummer, with whom he marked 61 years on marriage on Aug. 21, 1981.

While in the Army, Plummer served in the battles of Aisne-Marne, Meuse-Argonne and Saint Mihiel.

He was a charter member and three times commander of American Legion Conewago Post 329, Elizabethtown. He joined the post 63 years ago and served as its service officer for more than 50 years. He was recognized with the Legion Distinguished Service Award in 1975, the highest honor presented by the Pennsylvania American Legion. He served as commander of the American Legions District 10 in Lancaster County several times. A member of the Forty et Eight.

He also had been president of the Friendship Fire and Hose Company, Elizabethtown, for more than 20 years.

An active community leader, Plummer was a charter member of Boy Scout Troop 1, Elizabethtown, and the Boy Scout Council, Elizabethtown. He served for many years on the Boy Scout Council of Lancaster County and received the Silver Beaver Award several years ago, the highest honor in scouting. He first joined the Boy Scouts in 1912.

A member and Past Master (1928) of Abraham C. Treichler Lodge 682, Free and Accepted Masons, Elizabethtown, he belonged to the Lancaster Lodge of Perfection, Harrisburg Consistory and Zembo Temple. He was also a member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge 590, which presented him its Citizen of the Year Award in 1963. Plummer was an organizer of the Harvard Professor Elizabethtown Chamber of Commerce and served as its first secretary. He was a member of the Benevolent and Protective Order Elks, Elizabethtown; the Slumbering Groundhog Lodge, Quarryville, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Fred F. Barley Post 5667, Elizabethtown. Plummer was also a member of Christ Lutheran Church, Elizabethtown.

Born in Elizabethtown, he was a son of the late William D. and Dora Shrite Plummer. Surviving, besides his wife, are a son, Richard K. 

Mrs. Schwanger died instantly in the crash. Dr. Miles G. Newman, a deputy coroner, said he found her in the back seat.
